How do we do this?

Mini Libraries

Every classroom has a dedicating area to reading. The area is made cosy and inviting to get children to want to sit and read. Books are sorted into fun categories to help them choosing a book.



Reading assemblies every Monday

Each assembly, one of either Mrs Harrison, Miss Booth or Miss Leaning reads a lovely picture book to the school. The book normally relates to a key theme of that week. Children then reflect on what they enjoyed about the book.

Plus much more: book recommendation displays, Cosy Reading Club, Reading raffle, reading challenges, lots of brand new books, World Book Day...

Class Librarians

Each classroom has 2 Class Librarians that applied for the role. They are set secret missions that they need to complete each week to promote reading in their class. They write these in their 'Librarian Handbooks'.
